KZN Dialogue Report

Outcome of 20 October Dialogue

On October 20th, 2017 the NFDI hosted its 2nd Regional Dialogue at Aldinville Senior Primary in KwaDukuza (Stanger), KwaZulu-Natal. The event was hosted by the Chief Albert Luthuli Foundation (CALF) and in attendance were representatives from the Desmond and Leah Tutu Foundation, Thabo Mbeki Foundation and the FW de Klerk Foundation. The theme of the dialogue was “*Political Tolerance and the Challenge of Inclusive Governance: Building a united and non-racial society*”.



The event was attended by 100 delegates including prominent political stalwarts, the KwaDukuza community, the private sector, faith-based communities, student formations and other organisations.

The Programme Director, Ms Nana Ngobese-Nxumalo introduced Mr Khumalo, the principal of Aldinville Senior Primary who opened the event and welcomed all delegates. The Aldinville Senior Choir was in attendance and sang the National Anthem. Mr Khumalo thanked CALF for choosing Aldinville Primary to host NFDI’s 2nd Regional Dialogue. It was noted, the late Chief Albert Luthuli taught at Aldinville Primary.



The Chairperson of the NFDI, Ms Nomhle Canca, informed delegates, the week of 16 October 2017, marked 65 years since the late Chief Albert Luthuli was elected as President of the ANC and a further milestone was in this week, 55 years ago, when Chief Albert Luthuli received the Nobel Peace Prize.

The speakers at the event represented Faith, Community, Business, Student and Political perspectives.



Delegates formed 4 working groups to identify and address the five critical issues the region currently faces.
